For produce and antiques, visit "Paris" in Littleton

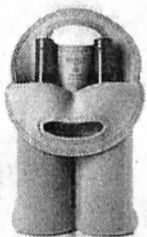

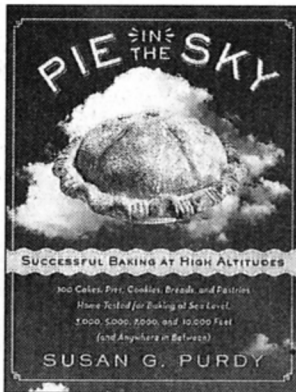
Chill out in style
